Spay/Neuter - German Shepherd Dog - another warning released

Dr. Benjamin L. Hart, DVM, PhD, University of California, Davis, studied the impact of early spay and neuter and the disease risk in dogs. His report focused on "Adverse Long-term Health Effects of Neutering in Different Breeds of Dogs".

His research included the German Shepherd Dog, which today is "the most important military and police canine dog". His findings show that for German Shepherd Dogs, 7% of the intact males and 5% of the intact females were diagnosed with one or more joint disorders. But the neutering of either sex at less than 6 months, or between 6 months and 11 months, increased the incidence of one or more joint disorders by 3-fold over that of the intact dogs, resulting in as high as 22% of dogs having a joint disorder. Hart also found that the occurrence of cancers was especially low in the intact males and females – 3% or less and that urinary incontinence, a very inconvenient problem was not found in the intact females, but increased to 7% in females neutered in the first year.

His study was consistent with several other studies. Delaying neutering and spaying German Shepherd Dogs until they are at least 1 year old markedly reduces the likelihood of one or more disabling joint disorders. Delaying spaying of females beyond 1 year also reduces the chance of urinary incontinence, while not increasing the chance of mammary cancer.

Virus H3N2 Strikes

The University of Wisconsin-Madison's School of Veterinary Medicine reported at least 1,000 dogs in Illinois, Wisconsin, Ohio and Indiana affected with the virus (H3N2). It is believed to have come from Asia. An older strain (H3N8) has also been detected. Both viruses cause persistent cough, runny nose and fever in dogs. The H3N2 infection has been associated with some deaths.

THE CLUB. Records are vague, but it seems that The German Shepherd Club of Atlanta was founded in the 1955 when a small group of breeders and owners interested in the German Shepherd Dog met in Atlanta Georgia.

The first president was Mrs. Michelle Leathers Billings who passed away in October 2013. Their purpose was the improvement of the breed.

Today the Clubs goal is the same. Through programs and activities members learn about all aspects of the German Shepherd Dog, including mental and physical development; the breed standard, working ability, breeding, care and rearing of puppies, etc.

Programs are presented at monthly meetings held on the second Thursday of month, except for July, September, and December. Meetings are at 8:00 PM. Both prospective members and non-members are welcome. The club holds numerous special events including two breed Specialties shows each year and also Obedience and Rally competitions. Puppy matches, Temperament Testing and AKC Good Citizen tests are scheduled through the year.

In July, at the Annual Awards Banquet, trophies are presented to members whose dogs have earned titles over the year. A Holiday party is held in December. If there is an interest, show handling classes are offered to members.

- 1. Has a history of at least 5 years involvement with AKC events.
- 2. Earned AKC Conformation, Performance or Companion* event titles on a minimum of 4 dogs from AKC litters they bred/co-bred.
- 3. Member of an AKC club.
- 4. Certifies that applicable health screens are performed on your breeding stock as recommended by the Parent Club. (OFA Hips and elbows, + GSDCA Temperament test)
- 5. Demonstrates a commitment to ensuring 100% of the puppies produced are AKC registered.
