Who are We?

The German Shepherd Dog Club of Atlanta, Inc. is a nonprofit organization chartered in Georgia in 1974. Our club objectives is to uphold the intents and purposes as stated in the Articles of Incorporation, and to conduct sanctioned and licensed specialty shows and all AKC events for which the Club is eligible under the rules of the American Kennel Club. Further, to conduct approved GSDCA-WDA events under the authority, rules and regulations of the German Shepherd Dog Club of America Working Dog Association, Inc.

In general, Our records are vague, but it seems that The German Shepherd Club of Atlanta was founded in the 1956 when a small group of breeders and owners interested in the German Shepherd Dog met in Atlanta Georgia. The first president was Mrs. Michelle Leathers Billings. Their purpose was the improvement of the breed; through programs and activities members learn about all aspects of the German Shepherd Dog, including mental and physical development; the breed standard, working ability, breeding, care and rearing of puppies, etc. Today, the Club's goal is the same.

Our club is part of the Southeast region. In total there are <u>9 different regions</u> with about 78 registered clubs who are members of the parent club <u>German Shepherd</u> <u>Dog Club of America (GSDCA)</u>. Each club host specialty dog shows throughout the year, where fanciers/exhibitors/German Shepherd lovers a like can come together to observe and exhibit the breed.



I joined the GSDC of Atlanta in 1972, moved out of the area and continued in obedience with my dogs until we moved back to Atlanta in 1984. I rejoined the club in 1988 after my old dogs had died and I purchased a puppy from Caralon Kennels.

I've had dogs that were shown in conformation, obedience, rally, herding, FastCat, and dabbled in tracking and nose work.

Club's Breeder Referral

I offer referrals towards our club members first. If I don't know of any club puppies, I offer names of others local to our area that I know offer a good dog and will stand behind their puppies. And I give no preferences to anyone – I try to be as unbiased as possible.

The below questions are based on my experience as a breeder and owner. My first dog purchase in 1968 was an inbred father/daughter litter, and he had the most titles of any dog in his 5-generation pedigree – a CDX. I will credit him with establishing my love of the breed and we had a lot of fun.

Members, keep me in the loop! Let me know if you're having puppies, planning a litter, or have a dog you want to place.

Questions that I ask callers

Have you ever owned a GSD before

What area of town do you live in or does it matter how far away the puppy is located

Do you have a fenced yard or what is your exercise plan

Do you want a puppy or an older dog

What do you want to do with your dog - pet, show, performance, etc.

How did you find out about the club

Questions I advise callers to ask the person with puppies. Callers frequently know of "puppies" from a friend knows someone who has a litter.

What health screenings do the parents have, i.e. OFA, DM, etc.

Make sure you meet the dam of the puppies, if you don't like her leave

How old is the dam

Do they have both parents on site

I tell everyone that calls – your dog needs a job – if you don't give him one, they will make their own job.

Everyone has their own hot buttons and these are mine. I've been fortunate to have great mentors over the years. Scootie Sherlock of Caralon Kennels, was my first mentor and was always there for me even after I no longer had a dog from her bloodlines. Find yourself a mentor and then listen.



It's only a few days into the new year, but across the country, 46 states and Congress are preparing to convene or have started meeting. City and County lawmakers are also ramping up their legislative agendas for 2024. And already, there are many severe threats facing dog owners and enthusiasts:

- Forsyth County, Georgia, is seeking to regulate the sale of a puppy from even one litter of puppies.
 - The U.S. Congress is due to pass "Farm Bill" funding authorization for the U.S. Department of Agriculture and all its programming (The measure was originally scheduled for 2023, but congressional delays mean it is likely to be considered in early 2024.). Because USDA is reauthorized only once every five years, anti-breeder groups typically seek to add language from anti-breeder bills to this must-past legislation. Problematic target bills this year include the Puppy Protection Act (H.R. 1624) and Goldie's Act (H.R. 1788), which would establish problematic one size fits all restrictions on dog breeding and allow for federal inspectors to immediate seize and euthanize dogs for concerns including "psychological harm", a term not defined in the bill.
- * Also in Congress, the "Better CARE for Animals Act" (H.R. 5041/S. 2555) could remove current licensing exceptions including exceptions for hobby breeders in the federal Animal Welfare Act (AWA) –and circumvent U.S. Department of Agriculture oversight of dog breeding. Instead, it would allow the U.S. Department of Justice to file charges, seize animals and impose penalties –regardless of whether animal experts at USDA have determined or even alleged that there has been a violation of the AWA.

Outreach to policymakers before a major issue arises is the best way to avoid future bad legislation that will impact you. And, with the resources and tools we provide, it's easy to do.

It is crucial that clubs, dog owners, exhibitors, and breeders take the opportunity NOW to learn what you can do to advocate for your dogs and contact lawmakers BEFORE bad legislation (or additional bad legislation) that directly affects you is introduced.

Here are a few steps you can take that will help you and your clubs be the most effective advocates for your dogs in the coming year:

Introduce Yourself

You as dog owners, breeders, handlers, and club members are the experts when it comes your dogs – and you are constituents who live in the local community and will be directly impacted by proposals passed regarding dogs. Yet many lawmakers may not be aware of clubs and breeders in their area. In the AKC Legislative Action Center toolbox, you will find introduction letters for individuals and clubs that you can personalize to let lawmakers know that you are constituents and local experts.

Refresh Yourself on the Legislative Process

On the state and federal levels, it takes several steps in order for a bill to become a law. It's important to stay engaged through the entire process or until the bill stops moving forward. Taking action in the first committee hearing is essential – but the work doesn't stop there! Review our updated handout on how a bill becomes a law to remind yourself and your fellow dog owners of the many opportunities for engagement throughout the legislative process.

Share AKC Resources When Bills Arise

As mentioned above, it is essential that lawmakers hear from constituents in their community. Lawmakers care most about the people who live in their communities and who can impact whether they will be re-elected. However, AKC GR is here to help and be a resource for you. AKC GR is continuously updating our Legislative Action Center (www.akcgr.org) with new resources you can share with lawmakers. We especially encourage you to check out the Key Issues tab on the website, which has printable handouts, talking points, model legislation, and policy information to help you communicate effectively on a broad range of canine legislative issues.

Make Sure You are Receiving AKC GR's Communications – and Know What to Do When You Get Them

One of the most crucial things you can do is take action when you receive an alert about a proposal that will impact you. Throughout the year, AKC Government Relations will be issuing a number of alerts, informational updates, and other communications to keep you informed. Please be sure AKC GR has the most up-to-date contact information for your club's Legislative Liaison (LL) so your LL can quickly receive the information and share it with all club members and contacts. You can contact AKC GR at doglaw@akc.org with questions and updates.

We also recommend that you regularly check the AKC Legislative Action Center at www.akcgr.org for timely, critical updates. As a refresher, we encourage you to review our printable handout to help understand AKC Government Relations communications.

Also ensure you are signed up for our monthly Taking Command newsletter that provides legislative updates as well as articles on advocacy and outreach throughout the country and the latest resources we are offering to help you communicate on behalf of dogs.



FOREFACE

Head

The head is noble, cleanly chiseled, strong without coarseness, but above all not fine, and in proportion to the body. The head of the male is distinctly masculine, and that of the bitch distinctly feminine.

The expression keen, intelligent and composed. Eyes of medium size, almond shaped, set a little obliquely and not protruding. The color is as dark as possible.

Ears are moderately pointed, in proportion to the skull, open toward the front, and carried erect when at attention, the ideal carriage being one in which the center lines of the ears, viewed from the front, are parallel to each other and perpendicular to the ground. A dog with cropped or hanging ears must be disqualified.

Seen from the front the forehead is only moderately arched, and the skull slopes into the long, wedge-shaped muzzle without abrupt stop. The muzzle is long and strong, and its topline is parallel to the topline of the skull.

Nose black. A dog with a nose that is not predominantly black must be disqualified.

The lips are firmly fitted.

Jaws are strongly developed. Teeth -42 in

number—20 upper and 22 lower—are strongly developed and meet in a scissors bite in which part of the inner surface of the upper incisors meet and engage part of the outer surface of the lower incisors. An overshot jaw or a level bite is undesirable. An undershot jaw is a disqualifying fault. Complete dentition is to be preferred. Any missing teeth other than first premolars is a serious fault.

Junior Members: Must be 9 years of age and not more than 17 years of age and shall subscribe to the same criteria as Regular Membership with the exception of the requirement to pay dues. Junior members cannot vote, hold office, or serve on committees other than junior committees.
