



Tips For Keeping Your Dog Safe This Summer

Summer is the time to have outdoor fun with our dogs. Longer walks in the park, ambitious hikes, beach days, or family travel—the sun is shining, and the outdoors is calling.

But hot weather can also make us uncomfortable, and it poses special risks for dogs. From increased exposure to ticks and other insects to sunburn and even heatstroke, all sorts of things can go wrong for your dog in summer. Keep the following safety concerns in mind as the temperature rises, and follow our tips for summer safety for dogs. They will help you keep your pet happier and healthier during the dog days of summer.

Help Your Dog Beat the Heat

- Give your dog a shady spot to hang out on hot days or keep them inside where there's airconditioning. Doghouses are not good shelter in the summer because they can trap heat.
- Fill a child-size wading pool or pool designed for dogs with fresh water for your dog to cool off in.
- Never leave your dog in a closed vehicle on a hot day. The temperature inside a car can reach 100
 degrees Fahrenheit in just 20 minutes.
- · Provide plenty of cool, fresh water, perhaps in an insulated dog bowl.
- Avoid exercising your dog strenuously on extremely hot days. Take walks in the early mornings or evenings, when the sun's heat is less intense.
- Avoid exposing your dog to hot asphalt or sand, which can burn their paws, for any prolonged period.
- Be mindful of your dog's breed. Dogs that are brachycephalic (have a short head and snout), such
 as Bulldogs, Boxers, Japanese Chin, and Pekingese, have an especially hard time in the heat
 because they do not pant as efficiently as longer-nosed dogs. Keep your brachycephalic dog
 inside with air-conditioning.

Keep Your Dog Healthy in Summer

- Make sure your dog's vaccinations are up-to-date, especially since dogs tend to stay outdoors
 longer and come into contact with other animals more during the summer months.
- Keep dogs off of lawns that have been chemically treated or fertilized for 24 hours (or according to package instructions), and away from toxic plants and flowers.
- · Keep your dog's coat well-brushed,

Safety Tips for Taking Dogs to the Beach

- Give your dog a shady spot to rest, like a beach tent or their own outdoor beach pen.
- · Provide plenty of fresh water.
- Protect them against sunburn. Dogs, especially those with short hair, white fur, and pink skin, can
 get sunburned. Limit your dog's sun exposure during the day and apply sunscreen to their ears,
 nose, and coat before going outside.
- Check with a lifeguard for water conditions. Dogs are easy targets for sea lice and jellyfish.
- Keep a check on their activity. Running on the sand is strenuous exercise. A dog that is out of shape can pull a tendon or ligament, and running on wet sand can make their paw pads blister.
- Don't let your dog drink seawater, since salt will make them sick.
- Rinse them off at the end of the day. Salt and other minerals in ocean water can damage your dog's coat.
- Check local ordinances before heading out. Not all beaches allow dogs, and some restrict the time they can be there.

Keep Your Dog Safe in the Water

- Let your dog go for a swim. Some dogs are natural swimmers, while others won't get a toe wet.
 Never force your dog into the water. Follow these water safety tips and be mindful of your dog's preferences and skills before sending them out to ride the waves.
- Don't let your dog overdo it. Swimming is hard work, and they may tire quickly. When swimming
 in the ocean, be careful of strong tides.
- · Never leave your dog unattended in water.
- · Put your dog in a life jacket.

Traveling in Summer With Your Dog Traveling With Your Dog on a Plane

- Be aware that many airlines will not ship animals during summer months due to dangers caused by hot weather. Some will only allow dogs to fly in the early morning or in the evening. Check with the airlines for specific rules.
- Put ice packs wrapped in a towel or an ice blanket or cooling mat in the dog's crate if you do ship a
 dog. Two-liter soft drink bottles filled with water and then frozen work well.
- Provide a container of fresh water, as well as a container of frozen water that will thaw over the
 course of the trip.

Traveling With Your Dog By Car

- Keep your dog cool in the car by putting ice packs wrapped in a towel in their crate. Make sure
 the crate is well-ventilated.
- Use a cooling pad as a bed or crate liner.
- Put a sunshade on your car windows.
- Bring along fresh water and a bowl, and a tarp or tent, so you can set up a shady spot when you stop. Keep a spray bottle filled with water to spritz your dog with to cool them down.

Why Do Dogs Overheat?

Exercise, excitement, or infection can cause a dog's temperature to rise normally. But when a dog's body temperature rises only a few degrees over 102 degrees Fahrenheit, a dog becomes overheated, and it's important to take action before heat exhaustion occurs.

When humans sweat, heat is transferred from the moisture over our entire body to drier, cooler air around it. Evaporation of this sweat cools us, and a fan makes it happen faster. However, as former French Bulldog Club of America president Jan Grebe, Ph.D., notes, "Dogs don't sweat." At least, not how we experience sweating.

Dogs pant because they have few sweat glands. Dogs inhale cooler, drier air through the nose and upper airways, exchanging that in the lungs for warm, moist air as evaporative cooling takes place (the dog's equivalent of our sweating mechanism). The breathing rate increases from 40 to 400 breaths per minute, with an occasional deep breath. After the dog sucks cooler air into the lungs, they exhale hot, moist air through the mouth over the dripping tongue, expelling excess body heat.

Panting animals, then, need enough cool water to drink on warm days to keep those airways moist, maintaining a delicate temperature balance. But if the outside environment is also very moist, less evaporation and cooling occur. This may result in a reduced tolerance for



Signs of Overheated Dogs

As a dog's temperature rises, blood rushes to the surfaces of the tongue, gums, and membranes to help transfer excess heat. Clear warning signs of overheating in dogs include frantic panting, extreme salivation, bright-red membranes, and labored breathing. The condition may quickly progress to a metabolic meltdown as their temperature rises to over 106 degrees Fahrenheit and dogs can no longer cool themselves.


An overheated dog may gasp for air, and the entire mouth will become grayish to purple because of the unmet oxygen demand. As the dog becomes dehydrated, their saliva thickens,

and the dog may vomit or have diarrhea. If they're unable to stand, the dog might even have a seizure, become comatose, and die.

Even if you're able to cool down your dog and they're acting normally, it's best to rush them to an emergency clinic in case they've experienced organ damage.

Why Do Some Dogs Overheat More Easily?

All dogs are vulnerable to heatstroke, and every owner needs to be acutely aware of their dogs' limits. Some short-snouted dogs may be more sensitive to high heat and humidity, so owners should pay close attention to their breathing. Also, even dogs accustomed to exercise may overheat easily when exercising on hot days.

Grebe warns, "Anything that causes brachycephalic dogs to breathe harder places additional stress on their airways, whether it is overheating on a hot day, excitement that causes panting, or exercise that increases the oxygen demand of their muscles, requiring more strenuous breathing."

Keep a close eye on double-coated dogs when summer temperatures rise, when traveling, or when there's an unusual heat wave in your area. Although a dog's coat can provide insulation from both heat and cold, double coats can make a dog more vulnerable to overheating. Black and other dark-colored coats also absorb heat faster in the sun.

Overweight or elderly dogs are also significantly more susceptible to overheating and heatstroke. Any extra layers of fat in a dog's body can act as insulation, trapping heat inside their body. As a result, they can overheat more quickly. For older dogs, they're more likely to have certain health conditions like heart disease, which can make it more difficult for their bodies to cope with the effects of high temperatures.

How to Keep Your Dog From Overheating

If you think your dog is overheating, Grebe advises that you quickly move them to a cool place. Immediately spray cool (not cold or icy) water on the coat, ensuring it reaches the skin. Cold water tends to constrict the surface blood vessels in the skin and this reduces, instead of increases, heat loss. Here are other ways to help prevent overheating in dogs:

- Ensure that your dog always has plenty of fresh water and shade. Only put them outside for short periods in hot weather.
- Use a variety of dog cooling products, such as vests and wraps, cooling mats, or cooling beds for dogs
- Don't leave your dog in the car in any weather, whether or not the windows are cracked. Even on a cool day (the mid-60s), the temperature in a closed car rises to 130 degrees Fahrenheit in minutes. The dog's own body temperature increases the heat and moisture, especially for larger breeds, using up oxygen. Death can occur within 15 minutes.
- Get your dog used to hot weather gradually. Don't exercise them on hot, humid days. Even sporting dogs can overheat if the water is too warm.
- Make sure to keep your home cool on warm days. Install a temperature alarm in your house, motor home, or van that contacts your cell phone automatically. If air conditioners and electricity fail and owners aren't aware, dogs may be in danger.
- Don't place crated dogs under tents or in places that have poor or inadequate ventilation or warm, stagnant air
- Carefully observe elderly dogs, those that are chronically ill, or pets that have trouble breathing
- Be careful whenever you're using dog dryers, especially cage dryers
- Contact your veterinarian or your breed club and ask about heat sensitivity in your
- Use an electric fan to draw heat from the blood at the body surface. You can also fan an overheated dog yourself if an electric fan is unavailable

Observe your dog carefully, and if you notice symptoms of overheating, don't wait until it's too late. Take precautions to prevent overheating, and know when it's time to take immediate action.



Barn Hunt is based on the traditional roles of many breeds in ridding farms, barns, crop storage areas, and homes of destructive vermin. Some breeds were specifically created to fill this role, and for many of those breeds, Barn Hunt provides their first true opportunity for



responsible breeders to test proper working traits in their dogs. Barn Hunt is also open to any dog of any breed or mix who wishes to play the game and can fit through an 18" wide by bale-height tall tunnel. Barn Hunt has titles, levels of increasing difficulty, and championships. Barn Hunt is an independent sport, but titles are recognized by the American Kennel Club (AKC), the United Kennel Club (UKC), and the Canadian Kennel Club (CKC). To see how to get your title recognized, go to FAQs and About (AKC/UKC/CKC).

Barn Hunt holds rat care at the highest level of consideration. The rats used in Barn Hunt are beloved family pets. They jump eagerly into their safe, comfortable aerated tubes and truly enjoy interacting with the dogs.

We're a great sport for older dogs, and older people too! Tripod dogs can compete, and so can deaf dogs. Blind dogs and dogs in wheeled carts can compete in Line Drive. Herding: Get Started

The purpose of noncompetitive herding tests is to offer herding breed owners a standardized gauge by which a dog's basic instinct and trainability are measured.

The purpose of the competitive herding trial program is to preserve and develop the herding skills inherent in the herding breeds and to demonstrate that they can perform the useful functions for which they were originally bred. Although herding trials are artificial simulations of pastoral or farm situations, they are standardized tests to measure and develop the characteristics of the herding breeds.

Dogs must have training and prior exposure to livestock before being entered in tests or trials. Both parent and local clubs should provide opportunities for such training and exposure.

A dog is not required to work in any particular style. A dog may compete on whichever course its handler chooses.

Herding tests and trials are sports and all participants should be guided by the principles of good sportsmanship both in and outside of the test and trial arenas. (AKC Herding Regulations Handbook, Chapter 1, Section 1, page 3).

The first step to getting started in Herding Test and Trials is to request a rulebook from AKC so that you are familiar with what will be required of you and your dog at these events. You can request a book of regulations be sent to you or you can pick one up at an event or you can copy it from the webpage in the link.

While waiting for your rulebook to arrive, you can contact your National breed club or a local herding breed club by going to the club search section of the AKC website. Then it is time to start working with your dog.



The initial test is called *Instinct Test* and it is a test for herding breeds, Rottweilers, Samoyeds, Standard and Giant Schnauzers, Pyrenean Shepherds, Swedish Vallhunds, Norwegian Buhunds and Greater Swiss Mountain Dogs. The dog needs no training before entering this class and may be handled by the judge, owner or a designated handler. The judge is looking for the dogs ability to move and control

livestock by fetching or driving. View an actual HI Evaluation Form.

As soon as you get a puppy, you can get them to chase things and then get them to stop on command. Have them stay while you throw that favorite toy. Basically you are putting rules on the game of chasing. Take your young dog to a facility and just get them use to listening to you while around livestock and pens. It is important that you own the game.

Each dog is different. Some need encouragement while others need to learn to listen while livestock is being worked around them.

I joined the GSDC of Atlanta in 1972, moved out of the area and continued in obedience with my dogs until we moved back to Atlanta in 1984. I rejoined the club in 1988 after my old dogs had died and I purchased a puppy from Caralon Kennels.

I've had dogs that were shown in conformation, obedience, rally, herding, FastCat, and dabbled in tracking and nose work.

reeder Referral

offer referrals towards our club members first. If I don't know of any club puppies, I offer names of others local to our area that I know offer a good dog and will stand behind their puppies. And I give no preferences to anyone – I try to be as unbiased as possible.

The below questions are based on my experience as a breeder and owner. My first dog purchase in 1968 was an inbred father/daughter litter, and he had the most titles of any dog in his 5-generation pedigree – a CDX. I will credit him with establishing my love of the breed and we had a lot of fun.

Members, keep me in the loop!

Let me know if you're having puppies, planning a litter, or have a dog you want to place.

Questions that I ask callers

Have you ever owned a GSD before

What area of town do you live in or does it matter how far away the puppy is located

Do you have a fenced yard or what is your exercise plan

Do you want a puppy or an older dog

What do you want to do with your dog – pet, show, performance, etc.

How did you find out about the club

Questions I advise callers to ask the person with puppies. Callers frequently know of "puppies" from a friend knows someone who has a litter.

What health screenings do the parents have, i.e. OFA, DM, etc.

Make sure you meet the dam of the puppies, if you don't like her leave

How old is the dam

Do they have both parents on site

I tell everyone that calls - your dog needs a job - if you don't give him one, they will make their own job.

Everyone has their own hot buttons and these are mine. I've been fortunate to have great mentors over the years. Scootie Sherlock of Caralon Kennels, was my first mentor and was always there for me even after I no longer had a dog from her bloodlines. Find yourself a mentor and then listen.






